

This is a lovely book, and I'm thankful the author wrote it. I'm surprised that it seems to be the only published book on Tudor Revivals in the US. If I could change anything, I'd want there to be more interior photos of smaller Tudor Revival homes. The homes featured in the books are mostly mansions. We live in a 1920s/1930s neighborhood that is packed with Tudor Revival homes in the 1800-2200 square foot range, and I would have liked to see beautiful Tudor Revival interiors that belong in smaller homes. For those of us working to restore or correctly remodel inside a Tudor home, there sure aren't a lot of resources out there... surely someone is interested enough in this architectural style to write another book!
