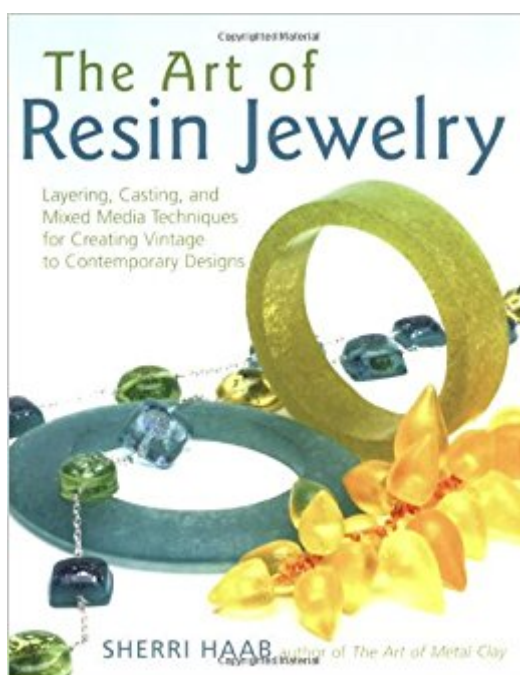


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# The Art Of Resin Jewelry: Layering, Casting, And Mixed Media Techniques For Creating Vintage To Contemporary Designs

Many of the projects are not my style preference, but written descriptions and pictures are clear and can be used for inspiration. Published in 2006, it is recent enough that the raw materials are still relevant and available.
