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Over And Under The Snow

Over the snow, the world is hushed and white. But under the snow lies a secret world of squirrels and snow hares, bears and bullfrogs, and many other animals making their winter home under the snow. This beloved nonfiction picture book exploring the subnivean zone reveals the tunnels and caves formed beneath the snow but over the ground, where many kinds of animals live through the winter, safe and warm, awake and busy, but hidden beneath the snow.

Gliding through the woodland on skis, a girl and her father watch for signs of animals. A squirrel's tail flashes red as he disappears down a crack in the snow. A fox steps into view. Guided by her father, the child becomes increasingly aware of "the secret kingdom beneath the snow, where voles pass through tunnels, bullfrogs sleep in mud, and a queen bee hibernates in the ground. A few appended pages offer more information about the animals mentioned and recommend books and websites for further reading. Neal's artwork, mixed media with digital elements, uses the white snow to isolate images of the people, animals, and trees within the natural setting. Cutaway views show what is happening beneath the snow as well as on its surface. Reminiscent of linocut prints, the illustrations have a retro look that suits Messner's precisely worded, effective story. A good choice for winter reading, this quiet but

eye-opening picture book could heighten a child's awareness of the natural world.

I bought a couple books on animals in winter BUT those books ended up really being about animals in fall preparing for winter (which is NOT what I needed). I bought some books on animals living in the arctic or antarctic, but that is not really what I wanted for the winter season. THEN I found "Over and Under the Snow." This book is actually about animal behavior in winter (not preparing for winter during autumn). The animals tunnel and eat under the snow, footprints reveal where animals wondered or slept above ground, predators pounce through the snow to catch prey, and others hibernate till spring. The back of the book has further details on the animals. My only complaint is that the father and daughter have very different skin tones. It makes the father look ghostly and not alive in comparison to the daughter. This was not a big enough issue to lose the book a star.

This is an interesting children's book about the animals who live underneath the snow, in pockets of warmer air, waiting for spring's warmth. I never heard of the subnivean zone before, so I learned something from this book.

I was expecting a very different book. It wasn't cute or clever. The science seems to be accurate, but a child who is interested in common wild animals may not learn anything that she does not already know. The illustrations are all in the same style as the cover, and are nice drawings but not extremely nice drawings. So I cannot tell you that the book is extra special for this reason or that reason. But I also found absolutely nothing that disappointed me. Everything about the book, pictures, information, storyline, was competently done and pleasant. I expect to enjoy this book for years, and probably would have enjoyed having it read to me from second or third grade on, and enjoyed reading it by myself a few years later.
