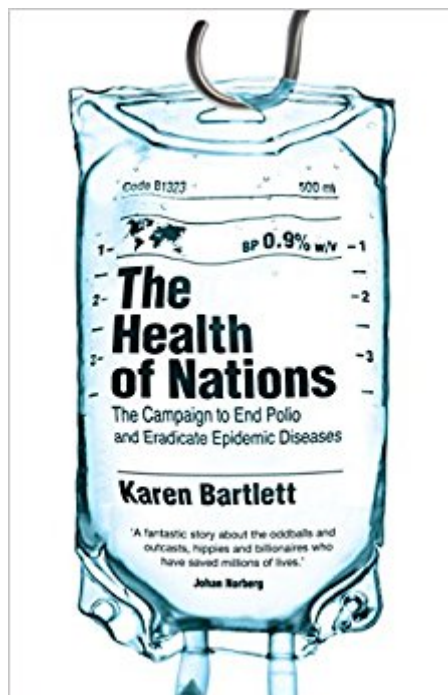

The story of polio ties together chapters on attempts to control or eradicate various infectious diseases, and Bartlett, a journalist, film-maker, and author, argues that the infrastructure developed by anti-polio campaigns is invaluable in controlling other infectious diseases. Quotes from infectious disease leaders, whom she has interviewed and researched, add to the interwoven stories. Several concerns and questions link the chapters together. Should the focus be on a single virus or on interventions at broader environmental levels? How can environmental costs be anticipated and weighed? How should local control be balanced with the expertise and efficiency of international public and private organizations? How has the balance between individual liberties and the public's health evolved over the centuries?
