

This was a beautiful look at a staunch Protestant's journey into Catholicism, as well as his wife's conversion. The book definitely was inspiring and encouraging to read this book especially being a Catholic as Dr. Scott Hahn has proven with the use of scriptures to refute the primary belief of Protestants such as "Sola Scriptura" or the bible being the sole authority of the Christian Church despite having it in 2 Timothy 3:16-17 "All Scripture is [a]inspired by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, for [b]training in righteousness; so that the man of God may be adequate, equipped for every good work" after referring to 2 Thessalonians 2:15 " So then, brethren, stand firm and hold to the traditions which you were taught, whether by word of mouth or by letter from us" - a verse that upholds tradition - and Matthew 16:17-19 "And Jesus said to him,

Evidently, Jesus established a SINGLE CHURCH and NOT CHURCHES MADE UP OF 30,000+ DIFFERENT DENOMINATIONS (and still increasing). Added to that, it has proven that GOOD WORKS and FAITH are essential to Christianity and not faith alone as proven by James 2:17 "Thus also faith by itself, if it does not have works, is dead." This was well explained by Dr. Scott Hahn especially after he investigated the "errors" of the Catholic Church which only ended happily after he and his wife became Catholics themselves. Aside from the couple's conversion, the reader would also be happy on the fulfillment that the couple have received in reading the scriptures as they got more clarity and understanding in the scriptures. In addition to that, it was also nice to see them get blessed by the Blessed Virgin Mary, whom they never considered providing respect when they were Protestants. Now, they have definitely realized the importance of giving reverence and veneration of the Virgin Mary (Note: Catholics NEVER WORSHIP the Virgin Mary. They only VENERATE and REVERE her as Jesus would be his mother) from the many rewards they have obtained especially when their marriage was in crisis. Read and enjoy. The Catholic reader would definitely feel proud being a part of the Catholic Church. As for the Protestant reader, one could possibly get inspired on exploring Catholicism and possibly get converted and follow the footsteps of the Hahns. If the Protestant

reader did convert to becoming Roman Catholics, I personally would echo what the Hahns would probably say, "Come home to Rome!!!"

I joined the church back in 2004, but wandered away for far too long. Recently, I have felt God calling me back, so I bought this to help me along. Written from the perspective of both writers, this is an approachable book with a lot of emotional insight. It is a relatively short and easy read. I quickly and eagerly devoured the material.
