

When you watch golf on TV, you hear about this player doing this, or that player doing that, but you almost never get any back story or context to how they got there. This is an aggregate of many players' stories and if you are a golf fan, it's a good read. There are many sports writers... but very few who go beyond the game itself, but Feinstein is one of them. It's not the greatest book every

written (so no 5 stars) but for the category, it's pretty good.

I bought this book for my brother-in-law. He enjoyed reading it so I was pleased.

It's a little dated from the standpoint that most of the players profiled are no longer in the forefront of today's tournaments. Feinstein's writing style is fluid and easy to read. He is able to bring the emotional aspect to the game and how it plays out in real life. It gave me a lot more respect for how deep a game golf really is. Highly recommend for anyone interested in learning about the pro tour or a fan of golf in general.
