

I was pleasantly surprised by this book. It was really insightful in terms of intercession, prayer, and learning to partner with God's heart. I really appreciated Beni's perspective and hearing her personal experience and journey with intercession. She navigated an incredibly misunderstood subject in the church with such peace and understanding and avoided making her experience a theology. What I mean is that she gave you a peek into some scenarios in which she partnered with God, but never encouraged anyone to do the same thing every time as if there's only one way to intercede. It was refreshing and gave me a new found respect and hunger for partnering with God to see heaven on earth.

the author pointed out how intercessors can live out of the 'first and second realms', or the first and second heavens--instead of the third heaven, where the throne of God is. put yourself in the shoes of a knight in a suit of armor standing before the throne of Christ to receive a strategic military briefing--a prayer warrior being directed by the Word where to go. intercessor called by God, be drawn into the heavenly realm. the Father 'seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus', so 'set your hearts on things above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God.'(Eph 2:6; Col 3:1 NIV)the first heaven--the earthly realm--can become a place of continual striving for an intercessor who walks around and handpicks troubles, then chooses to carry the weight of every problem around day after day until their energy and ambition gradually dwindle. but intercession is virtually weightless for the prayer warrior who shifts the heaviness of their prayer list onto Christ. religious people needlessly carry burdens in various ways. consider another example: if a child of God conceals bitterness in their heart, it becomes their own way of showing Jesus that they do not believe his justice is good enough. especially when they use the word of God to justify personalized righteous indignation. such bitterness operates from the first and second heavens

instead of the third heaven where the throne of God is. there must be a paradigm shift in thinking to the kingdom of heaven.The Happy Intercessor (ebook)

I really enjoyed reading this book. Personally Beni's explanations helped me with situations in my life that I was hearing, yet not quite understanding. Also it is quite comforting to know that someone else is experiencing the same things and how marvelous it is that God is still in the miracle business. It truly is amazing how each one of us has a unique Gift given by the Holy Spirit and how diverse the Body of Christ is and how Jesus Christ uses each one of His children to advance the Kingdom of God as we seek His Truth.

Beni has put my heart on paper. I didn't think I was an intercessor because I didn't continue "carrying" burdens after praying about them. I wasn't depressed, or weepy. I know what God says and I pray it for people I know, our family, our places of employment, our community, our church, etc. Beni made me feel normal for talking to the air and atmosphere in and around our community. When others snickered about me doing that, our community didn't suffer from the hail storms and tornadoes that hit surrounding areas last year. Like Beni, I believe we are supposed to take our responsibility and authority seriously. I felt completely confirmed by Beni's book.

I truly value Beni Johnson and what she contributes to the body of Christ. This book stirred my heart. I love to pray and I found myself burnt out and felt led to read this book and I didn't walk away with all the answers but I walked away stirred, hungry, excited about my walk in God. I not only would recommend this but when I share with People I feel are called to intercession or just want to learn to pray I would make this a must read. If you are super sensitive to others and if you have ever been called Empathic, please read this book for your own hearts health. I am not saying that this stereotype is wrong, I am saying that this incredible book by Beni Johnson shows us a better, lighter, more powerful, HAPPIER way! The chapter on the praying from the third heaven will encourage you to stop and consider how you pray and from what realm. That alone will bring breakthrough and an increase in answered prayers! I actually went through this book with my own little group of Happy Intercessors! As we read it together and discovered the outings and outcomes that Beni and her group went on, we realized that we had similar stories... how refreshing to connect with intercessors who know, and enjoy the joy of the Lord! If you feel like you are or may be an intercessor, but that thought seriously scares you - this is a MUST READ! If you know you are an intercessor, but never really wanted to broadcast that out loud for fear of being stereotyped - dive into this book and find 'your people'!
