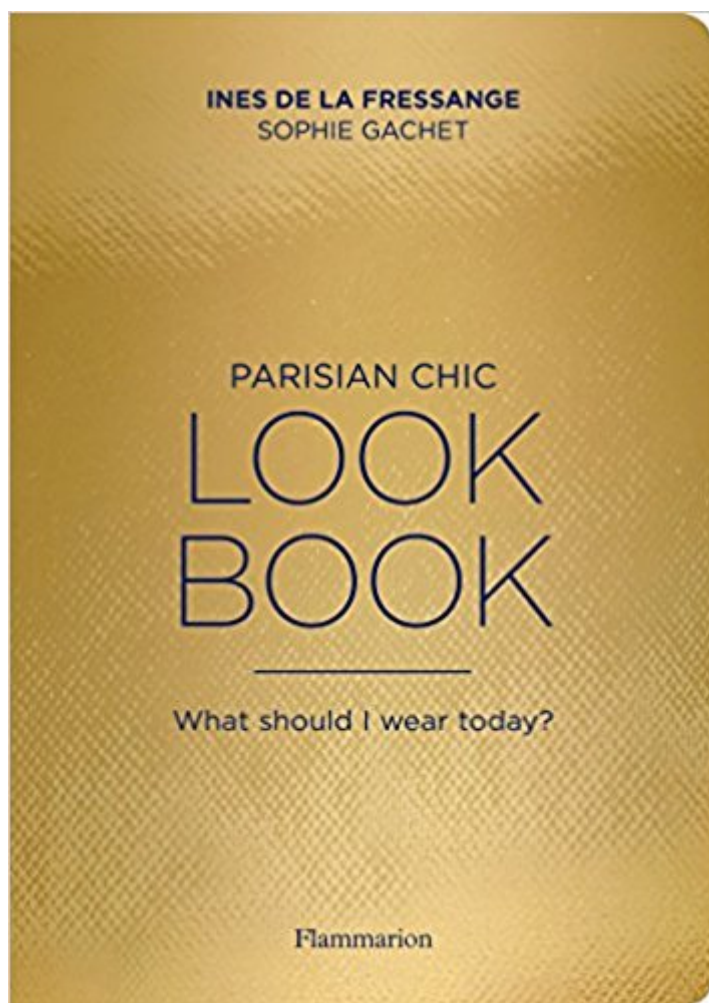




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Parisian Chic Look Book: What Should I Wear Today?
