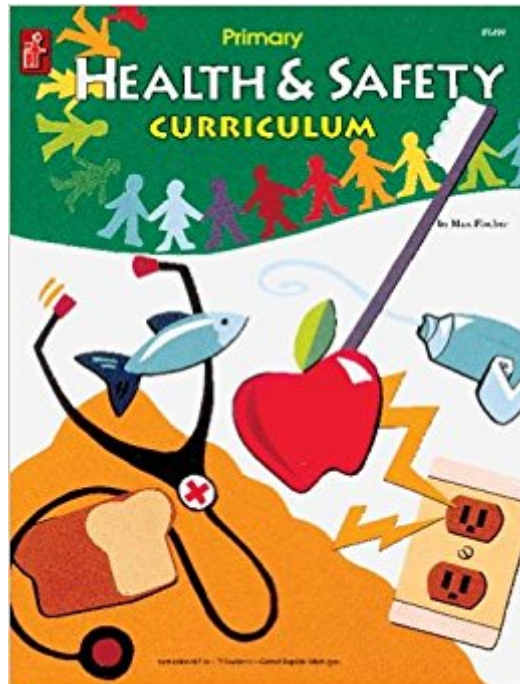

I completely disagree, maybe 11 years ago this is what you would show a 1st grader but not today. This is a primary edition which means about K-5 however it will not hold the attention of anyone younger than maybe 3rd grade. It has lots of endless rough paragraphs for a beginner reader, not many pictures, NO color at all and has confusing page after page of instructions called "lesson plans". This barely caught my attention and I was really disappointed. Most pages were handouts that the student has to complete and since the sentences are not for beginner readers there is no way I can ask my 1st grader to unscramble esophagus, let alone read a whole paragraph and answer long questions about the essay. It does have a lot of activities however they are more geared towards classes and need a lot of supplies, some including transparencies and overhead projectors. I homeschool so they were not homeschool friendly in my opinion.

It's a decent book to get ideas from. I use it to go over some topics that we might have covered or to learn something new. It's hard to find a good health book that kids can actually learn from and this one is okay.

We are homeschoolers and last year was our first year. We have to have a Health curriculum and this was a very good basic book for a first time homeschooler of a second grader. I would recommend this to others.
