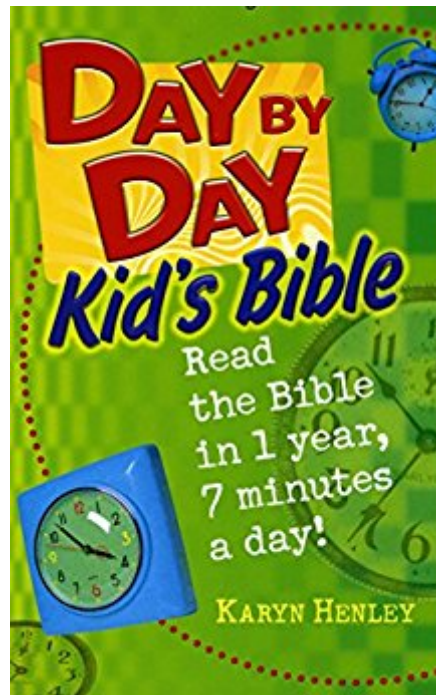

This is a good start for my 7 year old. He has heard a lot of Bible stories from birth, but never attempted to read the Bible before. He is going into second grade and this is perfect for his reading level. It is an easy read and easy to understand, with just 7-10 minutes per day. It doesn't feel overwhelming for him, and I don't have to make him read it. It is interesting enough that he wants to

read it on his own and check the box when he is finished. It also has 100 recommended bedtime stories in the back, and an AMAZING(in color) Time Line in the middle of the book that puts everything into perspective(even for me). I'm sure he will be proud to say he has read the entire Bible before the age of 8. (So will I) Incredible, so glad I found this!

I recommend this Bible for kids ages 8-12. If you have a 6-7 year old who can handle no pictures and is an avid reader, then it will suite them fine. However, any younger and it will be too advanced for them. My son is 7, almost 8 and reads very well (probably a few years ahead of his age) and this is just right. I also have the Begin to Read version for my 3 year old, and it lacks substance but is very brief. Overall, this is a great way to get them interested in the Word. I use this version as part of our homeschool Bible Study.

I think the idea of the daily reading is great, and the dates assigned to it. However, I am confused that some of the chapters are missing altogether and not in the bible, which takes a way from the credibility of the word. I only just found out on February 14th, that Judges 1, 4 and 5 were missing all together and it was not bunch with other chapters as this is also reference in some chapters. This was brought to my attention by my son, and as I checked through the bible, I realized that more than one chapters were missing. I am very disappointed I am unable to return it, because of the deadline, and return policy.

My 8 and 10 year olds read this most days. Sometimes they seem to think it is oversimplified, but they still enjoy reading it and understand it well. I think it's a great way to get them interested in the scriptures, without it being over their heads, and we want them in the scriptures!

Bought this for my then 5yo. He was able to read it a bit, but mostly we read to him. It took more than a year to get through it due to normal life, but we finished last year and decided to read it again this year. He's 7 and reads most of it with very few problems. Reading this has given him a really deep understanding of the story of God. He doesn't necessarily remember names and dates or order, but he had a good grasp on how things relate beyond just the typical Sunday school lessons of Noah and Jonah and David. One really helpful thing is that the books aren't in the order of a normal Bible, but merged into each other so the histories flow thoroughly together in chronological order.

Easy to read and spot on with keep the attention span of 1 graders

My 6-yr-old is a very advanced reader, so I was looking for a bigger kids' Bible that would manage to skate over the parts that are just too "old" for a 6-yr-old. This one does a good job in some areas -- manages to get through David and Bathsheba, and Abram and Hagar very well, w/o ever saying explicitly what happened. But there were a couple areas that were just too much -- violence, David cutting off Goliath's head, that sort of thing. When Bathsheba's baby died because of David's sin, that's just not easy to explain to a youngster. And it used the phrase "sexual sin" -- I'm just not ready to have that conversation yet. It's all true, and she'll one day have to read that stuff, but I just put it back on the shelf until she's a little older. Just too much for a gentle 6-yr-old's imagination. But still a well-done Bible, for sure.

I bought this as a kindle version, and I liked the Bible itself, being that it is a day by day Bible and that was what I was looking for. I was happy to see it didn't go by actual date, but disappointed that it didn't have headings for Day 1, Day 2, etc. I got confused as to where we were at and what day it was and stopped reading this version to my kids. I would have much rather it had headers for what day # the reading was.
