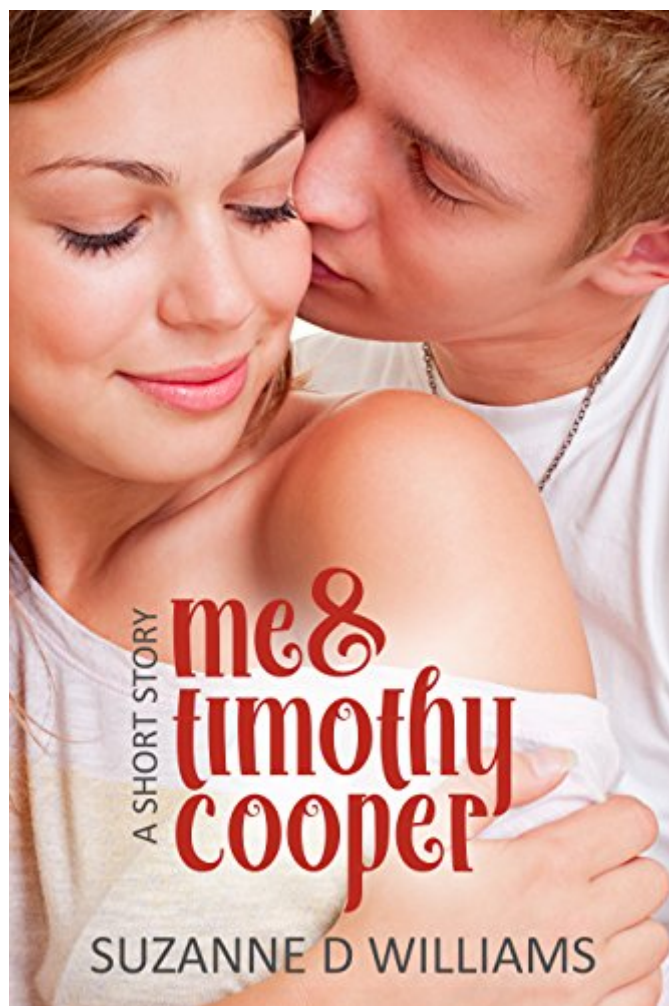

I have to start by saying that I am not the target audience for this book. Although I do enjoy the

occasional young adult or Christian romance, I am 32 and this book is aimed at Christian teenagers. Because I am not in the target age range, I upped my ranking from a 2 star to a 3 star, realizing that a younger reader may have gotten more out of it. That being said, this book really annoyed me. The entire book takes place within the span of a week and *SPOILERS* by the end of about the 2nd day (of them talking, not yet even dating) Timothy Cooper (always Timothy Cooper) has pretty much proposed. Did I mention, they're in high school? Because, of course, they can't have a discussion about wanting to maybe, possibly have sex with one another without being engaged. I'm not against waiting, but these characters can't even talk about sex without a plan to be married. One of my favorite books is "Christy" by Catherine Marshall. It's a Christian book written and set a looooong time ago, but there are more open and honest discussions of sex and faith way back then than there are in this book. By the end of one week in this story (and they weren't friends before this, again, this is one week of them talking to each other), they are engaged, and have declared their love for each other. The only conflict in the book occurs when Taylor spreads rumors about her and Timothy, and then gets mad because people believe them. She is briefly angry at Timothy because he doesn't immediately fix the reputation that she ruined herself. I also found it somewhat implausible that this girl, who is so hot that apparently the entire male population of the school wants to date her, has never been approached by any of these guys. The overall plot wasn't terrible, but some of these issues really bothered me. It could have been better had the author picked her issue to focus on, as this was a "lesson" book. There was the premarital sex, the dealing with grief, the being an outsider, and the supporting our troops themes, and they were all under-developed. For a book this size, things would probably have gone better if the author had just picked one of these to fully develop and explore.

This is a collection of stories. I could not even get through the first one. I'm so sorry. The idea for Me and Timothy Cooper was good, but the delivery was not. It started out promising with Timothy being this guy who has always seen Taylor and vice versa, falling into a moment where their worlds collide. What lost me was the oddity of it all, Taylor hurts her ankle and Timothy asks her to stay at his house, while her parents are gone for the weekend. Which may not sound odd, but again, it was the delivery. I think Taylor was super trusting. Who stays at a guy's house who she's never actually held a conversation with before? I think their relationship was too fast paced that it lost some believability. They fell for each other so fast, not even the night of day one and they were already joking about marriage. That kind of lost me... This book is also sort of religion based... which I wasn't expecting. So if that bothers you, you may not like this.

Short and easy read about first love with Timothy and Taylor! It is a clean read and although the two main characters were religious it was not overdone with religious overtones. The only issue I had with this book was how serious it got so quickly. Taylor apparently has had a crush on Tim since she started at the high school but Tim has never spoken to her until they get a school assignment together. At this point we are supposed to believe that this confident and good looking guy liked her as well, knew about her crush on him, but never spoke to her before now? Then after a few days together just getting to know and like each other he has made up his mind to marry her? Maybe it does happen this quickly for guys, and when you know you know, but to me it just didn't ring true. The only thing Tim really knew about Taylor at this point is that she is attractive and seemingly nice and this does not a marriage make! Of course this is only a novella and to wrap things up in a nice little bow maybe it made sense for the author to show that when you have a real relationship guys will wait until marriage for sex, which is a good point to make I just didn't see it really happening so quickly, but that could just be me :)
