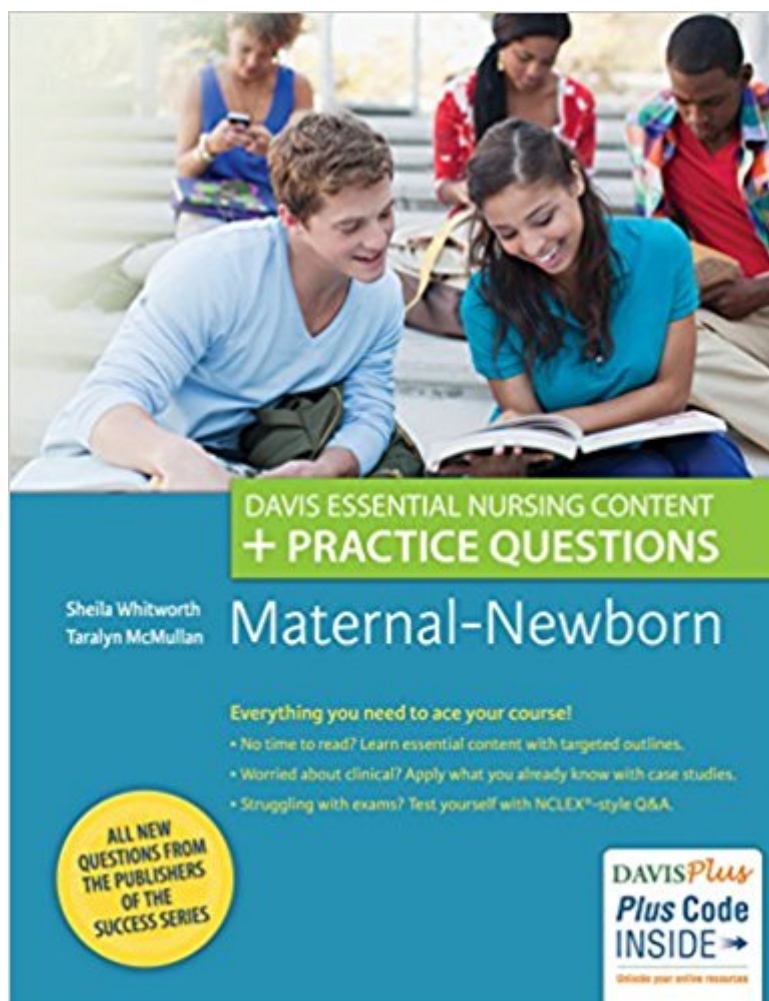


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Maternal-Newborn: Davis Essential Nursing Content + Practice Questions

This has really good content and is a very helpful review. They say that you either get maternal nursing or you don't. I made all As in all my classes but I struggled through maternity nursing like it was a combined class of advanced calculus of particle physics. I WISH I'd had this book then. This book is a soft cover and it is big and heavy. It will fit in a backpack but it's not easy to carry around. It does have a nice layout with good graphics, tables and charts, pictures and insets. The questions have answers with good explanations that help you understand why wrong answers are wrong as well as just giving right answers. This book could also be a big help to nurses who have to be pulled to a maternity/newborn unit a lot when it isn't their primary specialty, or for nurses that are changing their specialties.

Whitworth DNP RN and Taralyn McMullan DNP RN CNS-BC is very much content review, questions and answers, with test tips mixed in. It is very organized and information intensive, as expected from F.A. Davis publication. I like these line of books when they are strictly questions and answers because I prefer less clutter, but even when they have review content, F.A. Davis keeps the information streamlined and the authors here do that as well by keeping the information tightly organized as key terms/glossary, outlined topics or bullet/numbered lists. There is no fat or extraneous information and the content is meant to keep the person studying on subject and in focus which it does very well.

I keep a huge number of these study guides on hand for students that may not have access to their own which also means I have the opportunity to review a lot of them from pretty much all the major publishers. Davis is one of the better publishers and this is one of the less known topic areas so it would seem like a no-brainer to be above average...unfortunately it's only moderately so. Why? Simple - maternal/newborn is a challenging area to begin with so it is absolutely essential to include proper communication to the mix of clinical skills. The case studies also fail to fully appreciate some of the nuanced situations likely to be encountered. This does a great job with the standards as well as frequently encountered situations. Overall a very solid study guide.

Each section has great information, bullet points and outlines, key terms, diagrams, and review questions with detailed answers and explanations. The book has wonderful use of color, not only for illustrations, but also for tables and headings to help keep information organized. This book also has test taking tips and a final exam. I think it's a great resources for when you're taking a class and want some extra study material or if you're getting ready for an exam.

This is a concise and well-organized review for any RN studying to care for mothers and babies. I work with many students in our college's nursing program and am familiar with the NCLEX. Like other books in the series, it contains overviews and a list of essential topics along with NCLEX-style questions. It includes tables, charts, case studies and full-color illustrations. The online component offered additional test questions for practice. This book is great even for nurses not studying obstetrics in particular, since all health care students will deal with a pregnant person at some point in their work.
