

I just took my fourth trip to Tokyo in March, and the feelings Matthew describes having (as he is on the train to the airport at the end of the trip) mirror mine almost exactly. It's hard to leave a place like Tokyo and even a little harder to understand how it gets in your heart and won't leave. Because I love Tokyo the way I do, I also want to introduce close friends and family to the excitement it offers. I felt like expectations were high as Becky experienced the city for herself. You'll have to read it to see what she thought! An earlier reviewer mentioned the humor-it won't jive with everyone, no. But

this is a light-hearted, fun, quick trip through the food highlights of Tokyo, not a serious study of Japanese culture. I'm currently studying Shinto, so the shrines are hugely interesting to me, but they are ubiquitous and will always be there. The food is an ever-changing, yet also never-changing landscape that has to be experienced to be believed. This is what this book does do well, takes you on the journey too.
